Collamer Abbott was born in 1919 in Wilder, Vermont, where his mother was a school teacher and his father a storekeeper.

He graduated from the University of Vermont in 1941 and received a MA in Journalism from the University of Wisconsin, Madison under the GI Bill. He worked on several New England newspapers as a reporter, editor and photographer in the 1950's and 1960's.

In 1967 Collamer left the news field to teach English at Castleton State College in Vermont.

Today he lives in White River Junction and reads the New York Times, especially the Art reviews on Fridays.

Mr. Abbott passed away on Easter Sunday 2012, at the age of 93, in White River Junction, VT.
